Agriculture Intern Job Description

Job: Agriculture Intern is a seasonal summer position only. Your duties mainly include assisting the Ag Manager/Staff with all duties needed, including daily care and maintenance of all animals and the garden, assisting with planning and teaching Ag. related classes, maintenance of all barn related projects and items. Farm animals can include goats, a donkey, a miniature pony, ducks, chickens, cows and other animals if available. If you need something to do for the summer and want to further your knowledge in the agriculture industry this is your perfect opportunity. **Note - Admin has the right to change or alter this job description as they see fit at their discretion.**

Job Responsibilities:

- Assist with daily care of all animals (Cleaning stalls/pens, feeding, water etc.)
- Assist with regular maintenance of the garden (Planting, weeding, watering etc.)
- Assist with setting up needed barn areas prior to first week of camp (Stalls, paddocks etc)
- Assist with planning and teaching of classes as needed with Ag. Counselor
- Helping to ensure a safe but fun learning environment for campers
- Help ensure a safe and clean environment for all animals
- Work with other counselors as needed
- Work closely with and communicate/report with head Ag. Counselor as needed
- Report to the Equestrian Director as needed.
- Other duties as needed and as assigned by Equestrian Director and Admin Team

Job Requirements:

- Must be 14 years of age and older
- Must pass a CORI/SORI/NSOR provided by Camp
- Must be CPR/First Aid certified (Camp can provide if not currently certified)
- Should be able to lift approximately 50 pounds.
- Previous experience with farm animals/gardening is a bonus, but not required.
- Must have appropriate shoes on at all times to be in the farm barn area and around a variety of animals. Paddock boots, work boots or muck boots are accepted. Sneakers, sandals, flip flops or crocs are not allowed at any time in the barn area
- Physical endurance to be on one's feet walking, crouching, bending, twisting, reaching above head, and being physically active for a prolonged period of time.
- Follow all Camp Marshall policies and procedures at all times
- Attend all staff training as directed by Admin (provided by Camp)
